All Central Office staff at Montfort Centre were also given the opportunity to take part in a professional development session to discuss the truth of residential schools and opportunities for everyone to move reconciliation efforts into reconciliaCTION.

"The recognition of the intergenerational harm that residential schools inflicted, and to honour all those that have been impacted by this injustice, remains a critical part of the reconciliation path in our school communities. Each of our schools works to develop a program that resonates within their own community. This is part of our ongoing commitment to reconciliation and fostering understanding across our division," said Ryan Sawula, Associate Superintendent of Curriculum and Inclusion.

"Our goal is to create spaces where the voices of Indigenous peoples are heard and respected. The opportunity for each school to tailor its programming ensures that the day is not just a commemoration, but a learning experience rooted in the history, culture, and experiences of Indigenous peoples. This is an important step toward fostering reconciliation and ensuring that the legacy of residential schools is understood by all," said Jonathan Mauro, Indigenous Education Coordinator, highlighting the importance of collaboration and inclusivity.
